# **Greater Binghamton Clean Energy Careers Summit and Job Fair**

The Greater Binghamton Clean Energy Careers Summit and Job Fair, held on September 27, 2023, at the DoubleTree Hotel in Binghamton, NY, was a resounding success! Over 189 participants checked in to the event, which united industry leaders, educators, government representatives, and job seekers. The event ignited discussions on the limitless potential of the clean energy sector in the Southern Tier, focusing on inclusivity and opportunity for all, from newcomers to seasoned professionals.



# **Presenters and Speakers**







Assemblywoman Donna Lupardo set the tone for the event, highlighting that the region is poised for a clean energy transformation. She thanked the organizers for fostering collaboration across sectors. Lupardo stated, "We have all the ingredients for a clean energy economy."

Keynote Speaker Jennifer de Souza, Vice President of Energy Solutions, Supply Chain & Leasing at The Raymond Corporation, stirred the audience with her call to action. She inspired attendees to become believers in the region's clean energy potential through lithium ion battery manufacture and recycling, highlighting that change is possible and drawing on the region's history as the Valley of Opportunity.

Senator Lea Webb encouraged continued collaboration, reminding attendees, "All of us have a role to play in this work. There is room for everybody."



## **Panel Discussions**



Throughout the day, expert panelists engaged in insightful discussions. Jaden Beck, Clean Energy Project Associate with BlocPower, reinforced the sector's diversity of pathways, asserting, "Whether you're a creative, a communicator, a researcher, or a builder, there is a place for you in this industry."

Adam Flint, Director of Clean Energy Programs at Network for a Sustainable Tomorrow (NEST) and event co-host, underlined the importance of inclusivity, stating, "This transition only works if it includes everyone, especially those who have been most impacted by the current inequitable, dirty, and dangerous system."

Representatives from Cornell Cooperative Extension, BlocPower, ETM Solar, IM3NY, Soulful Synergy, The Raymond Corporation, BAE Systems, New Energy New York, and Southern Tier Community Center discussed the intersection of their work with the clean energy sector.

Paul Presendieu, Director of Community Engagement for Soulful Synergy, injected enthusiasm into attendees, declaring, "We are in the midst of a renaissance at all levels of government." He

highlighted New York's pivotal role in the national clean energy landscape and "making sure we are not leaving anyone behind.".

Dr. Gay Canough, founder of Extraterrestrial Materials Solar Works (ETM Solar), noted the silver lining of the energy transition, stating, "One great thing about the clean energy transition is that there is meaningful work to do." I think we need a quote here from someone in the second panel.

"We need to start thinking about where people are living—what is the condition that our workers are in when they're coming to work," said Ebony Hattoh of New Energy New York (NENY). "We've all heard that hungry kids can't learn, right? Well that applies to adults too."

Cory Balliet of BAE Systems said, "If we add climate impact to designs it pushes us to be much better." and "We need people, we need people to do the work."



# **Brainstorming Session**



The summit concluded with a brainstorming session led by facilitators from Binghamton University and New Yorkers for Clean Power. Attendees discussed topics such as education, transportation, livable wages, child care, immigration, housing, and raising awareness of opportunities. Everyone was asked to consider these topics from a job seeker perspective, an employer perspective, and an educator perspective!

# Job and Community Fair






We had 30 different companies and organizations sharing valuable employment opportunities and services, including some featured below!

## **Follow-on Activities**

The Greater Binghamton Area has a "Once in a Generation" opportunity to grow jobs and increase average income. We see the need for a minimum of 10,000 clean energy jobs for manufacturing, trades and the many services required to achieve New York State's climate goals. Much work remains to achieve this vision. We believe broad based collaboration of Industry, Business, Government, Education and nonprofits is required to drive progress. Below is a partial list of recommendations from our partners, panelists, and brainstorm session participants we can start with!

- Develop a collaboration to evaluate and implement state and federal funding opportunities.
- Develop an inventory of companies and their programs for job shadowing, interns, and part-time employment.
- Continue in depth interviews with clean energy career professionals about their role in the ecosystem.
- Identify what makes Greater Binghamton a magnet community, further action, and projects.
- Form teams on the high priority barriers.
- Strengthen access to under-served communities.
- Participate in job fairs and related events.
- Increase outreach and education development in schools.
- Meet with NENY to develop a holistic plan about what they will lead, support, and how others can help.
